Frequently Asked Questions

Is the park Pet Friendly?

No, the park is not pet friendly as we are located within a Wildlife Sanctuary. In fact pets are not permitted within the Lake Awoonga Recreation Area.

Can we have a fire?

Yes, but only in the Communal Fire Pits. We do not allow individual sites or cabins to have a fire.

Is there boat/kayak hire at the Lake?

No there isn't. The Caravan Park hires out fishing rods but not boats or kayaks.

Do you have drive through sites?

No, but some sites are large enough to stay hooked up.

Is there a Dump Point at the Park?

Yes there is and it is available for our Guests to use only. A public dump point is available at Benaraby and Calliope River.

Do you allow teenagers to stay at the Lake without parental supervision?

No we do not and if teenagers turn up without parental supervision we will not accept the booking.

Do you allow 18th or 21st birthdays?

No we do not. This park has a relaxed quiet atmosphere and for this reason, we do not allow parties. We have a quiet time between 9.30pm and 7.00am.

NOISE – What is the Park's Policy?

We have a quiet time between 9.30pm and 7.00am. However, we do not allow loud music, loud noise, unacceptable language or disrespectful behaviour at any time of the day/night. If you are spoken to by Management and you continue with the unacceptable behaviour you will be asked to leave or the police will be called.

We simply ask that you remember you are staying in a caravan park where there are other guests. You are to be respectful to them and be mindful of the affect your unacceptable behaviour has on everyone in the park. Plus, given this park is quiet, noise echoes.

Do you allow events at the park?

Yes we allow events/functions at the park. This is to be discussed and organized with management. We can also assist with arranging catering.

Can we ski on the lake?

Yes you can.

Do the cabins have separate bedrooms?

All of our cabins are open plan.

Is the park located on the water?

The park is set up high overlooking the lake, we are not located on the waters edge. It is a 5 minute walk down the hill to the lake to a large recreation area. There is also another recreation area and boat ramp located 2.5km from the Park.

Can you fish off the bank?

Yes you can. There are plenty of locations to do this.

What is the water level in the Lake?

What fish are caught in the Lake?

The Primary Species are: Barramundi, Mangrove Jack, Catfish, Saratoga, Sea Mullet

Is there Redclaw in the Lake?

Yes there is, but not in abundance like at other dams.
